#LifeAfterDaesh Progress highlights in Iraq and Syria

SOUTHWEST ASIA – The Combined Joint Task Force-Operation Inherent Resolve and its partners remain united in a long-term, international mission to create enduring security in Iraq and Northeast Syria to enable stabilization activities and humanitarian assistance.

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), is boosting support to internally displaced Iraqis returning to their towns and villages in an effort to mitigate some of the adverse effects of camp closures. UNHCR will release seasonal cash assistance to help IDP families meet their immediate needs in the coming winter months and provide legal assistance to families to obtain civil and property documentation. UNHCR are also working with partners to rehabilitate infrastructure in areas of return.

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) Iraq distributed non-food items kits to families in Laylan Camp, Kirkuk province. The kits included mattresses, bed sheets, kitchen sets and plastic mats, to respond to the needs of IDP populations residing in the camp. More than 1,320 families were reached with this assistance. This support for families in Laylan Camp was funded by the Government of Korea.

The U.S. recently collaborated with the Tabqa Civil Council, local education communities in Tabqa and Deir ez-Zor, and the Autonomous Administration of North East Syria Education Committee to provide school supplies for children. The U.S. provided 130,000 textbooks to 25,000 children in 181 schools in Tabqa. In total, this project will provide 400,000 textbooks to students in Raqqa and Tabqa. The U.S. is proud to work with school administrators and members of education committees to support Syrian children's right to learn.

United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) receives €26 million from Germany to support national systems and ensure vulnerable children in Iraq receive quality basic and social protection services in Iraq. The project focuses on long-term sustainability by strengthening national systems and capacities to provide integrated access to safe water, education and health services, protection, and social assistance, with the goal of enabling children to overcome poverty, practice their rights and fulfil their potential. It will be implemented at the Federal level and in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq, in partnership with the Ministries of Labor and Social Affairs, the Education, the Directorates of Education at sub-national levels, and national and international Civil Society Organizations.
