Highlights from Around the Coalition


SOUTHWEST ASIA – Across Iraq and Syria, the Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve works by, with and through our partner forces to ensure an enduring defeat of Daesh (ISIS). Italian Col. Stefano Panoni assumes command of the Kurdistan Training Coordination Center

The Italian-led Kurdistan Training Coordination Center (KTCC) held a transfer of authority ceremony at Camp Singara in Erbil, Iraq, Jan. 22, 2020.

Italian Col. Giuseppe Levato relinquished command of the KTCC to Col. Stefano Panoni. The ceremony took place in the presence of the Consul of Italy, Dr. Serena Muroni, and the Commander of the Italian Contingent and Director of Training for the Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve, Brig. Gen. Paolo Attilio Fortezza and the highest political and military authorities of the Autonomous Region of Kurdistan and other military guests of the Coalition.

Under Levato's leadership, four training cycles were completed, for a total of approximately 5,500 trained Peshmerga. Of particular relevance, training female personnel became a goal. As a result, 40 female soldiers have been recently trained.

Multinational Civil Affairs team enhances stabilization efforts across the region

The Civil Affairs section of Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve is commanded by Brig. Gen. Stéphane Dupont, French Air Force. The Civil Affairs section is made up of around 30 people of various nationalities, whose objective is to plan, and then carry out, actions for the benefit of the civilian environment.

The Civil Affairs section is active in many areas such as the protection of the population and provides advice to governmental and non-governmental organizations within the framework of stabilization projects. Their goal is to help improve essential services and infrastructure, and to contribute to the development of the local economy. It is also in direct contact with international relief organizations to monitor refugees and displaced persons, in order to facilitate their return to their region of origin.
