Highlights from Around the Coalition

SOUTHWEST ASIA – Across Iraq and Syria, the Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve works by, with and through our partner forces to ensure an enduring defeat of Daesh (ISIS). Mentoring, advising and assisting are key components for building our security partners' capacity to defeat Daesh remnants and create regional stability. Since 2014, the Coalition has military contributions from more than 30 nations.

French precision bomb destroys a Daesh hideout

A patrol of two French Rafales aircraft contributed to the reduction of the military potential of Daesh by firing an SBAS 38 AASM (modular air-to-ground weapon) bomb May 20, 2020.

The bomb destroyed a bed down location for Daesh fighters, which was used as one of their sanctuaries southeast of Mosul.

According to French Col. Benjamin Souberbielle, "The AASM is a formidable asset for the Coalition. Its variable capacity offers us innovative modes of action. Our enemies hide at the slightest noise. Firing from afar creates surprise and deprives the enemy of sanctuary."
