New equipment enables farmers to increase their productivity and improve farmer income in Karemlesh.

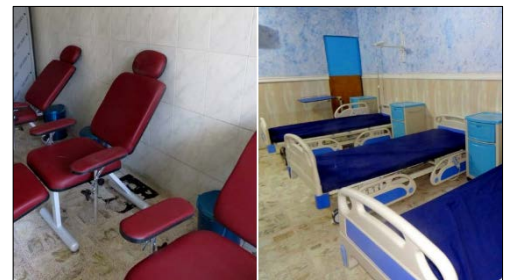

As Iraq transitions towards a post-conflict environment, the government and the international community are investing in stabilization activities that are essential to maintaining community security and bolstering the recovery process. The European Union (EU), through its Instrument Contributing to Stability and Peace (IcSP), supports the International Organization for Migration (IOM) in its efforts to reduce local sources of violence and support economic recovery. The funding will cover an 18-month project that aims to address political and economic grievances by empowering community leaders to better represent their constituents, engaging and mobilising young people, strengthening social cohesion, and improving job opportunities targeted communities. This will be done by providing mediation and peacebuilding courses, training sessions for community leaders to manage stress and

In order to encourage farmers to return to their farms in Sinjar, the Iraqi Community Resilience Initiative program (ICRI), funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), is working in partnership with the Yazidi Fraternity Organization (EFO) to restore 25 artesian wells. This project will support farmers resuming agricultural activities, create job opportunities for farmers and encourage internally displaced people to return to their homes.

The rehabilitation of 4.3 km long tertiary Irrigation Canal EC-9 in Yathrib, Balad, Salah Ad-Din will keep water flowing to 18,000 acres of farmland. Its rehabilitation will contribute to a more equitable distribution of water quotas among landholders, allowing nearby farmers to increase the yield of their fields and orchards and improve their economic conditions. Aside from the jobs created by UN-Habitat for Youth project for the farming families living in this area at a time when income is so critical, the restoration of the waterway to its full capacity will benefit approximately 13,000 people, many of whom are recent returnees.
