Defeating Daesh Highlights of the Week

SOUTHWEST ASIA – Our partners in Iraq and Syria are leading the way to find and eliminate ISIS fighters, finance, logistics, and media networks.

"Two big successes this week by our anti-ISIS partners in Iraq and Syria," said Col. Myles B. Caggins III, Coalition military spokesman. "Capturing an ISIS mufti in Mosul and the ISIS Oil Emir in Deir ez Zor, Syria will stymie the terrorists group's ability to recruit members and finance its operations; great work by ISF and SDF."

During the week of January 15-21, 2020, the following actions happened in Iraq:

 Jan. 15: The Iraqi Air Force and Army Aviation carried out a series of airstrikes, targeting positions held by ISIS sleeper cells in the Salah Ad-Din province. The operation was coordinated by the Salah Ad-Din Operations Command and took place in the rural areas in al-Shai Lake, Hamrin Mountains. The area has been a haven for terrorists who use it as a base to plan and launch attacks in the surrounding settlements and towns. Eight terrorists were eliminated and eight safe houses, two boats, a tunnel and a vehicle were destroyed.

Jan. 16: The Ninawa Police Command's SWAT team arrested a so-called sharia official and mufti of ISIS called Shifa al-Neama, nicknamed 'Abu Abd al-Bari', in the Mansour neighborhood in eastern Mosul after a series of investigations. al-Bari was working as a preacher at several mosques in the city of Mosul and was known for his provocative speeches against the Iraqi security forces, inciting affiliation and allegiance to ISIS and educating extremist ideology during ISIS' control over Mosul. He is considered one of the top ranking leaders of ISIS, and is responsible for issuing fatwas regarding the execution of a number of scholars and clerics who refused to pledge allegiance to ISIS.  Jan. 16: A joint force from the Samarra Operations Command conducted two search operations, in coordination with the 13th Brigade of Iraqi Federal Police, on the western Samarra Island. A large number of ISIS war materials were seized and disposed of and nine terrorists were arrested.  Jan. 17: Under the supervision of Baghdad Operations Command and in coordination with Federal Police Intelligence and the Iraqi 6th Division, a terrorist safe house was raided in the al-Tarmiyah area. 
